




Message from Pastor Shriyan

y dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we are in another Lenten season, let us focus on what Jesus Christ accomplished on the cross to redeem us from sin. Our God is holy, and He calls His people to be holy as well. Sanctification is vital for

every Christian. When we study the Scriptures, we see that God sanctified days, people, and priests. Even today, God is actively working in the process of sanctification.

Christ has loved the Church and gave Himself for her, so that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the Word (Ephesians 5:25-26). We are sanctified by the blood of Christ, which sets us apart for our Holy God. Sanctification is a process, and the Holy Spirit helps us along the way. It begins at the moment of salvation and continues throughout our lives, until the day we are perfected in Christ. We should strive to grow more like Jesus every day.

As the **Isaiah 6:8 program** at CGBC celebrates its first anniversary in February 2025, we have much to praise God for!

- His faithfulness in providing all our needs; physical, mental, emotional, financial & spiritual throughout this past year.
- For the Dev Piya Sevana(DPS), that supports us with a monthly stipend.
- Number of registrations have increased from 21 to 48.
- Starting off with 13 on our team of volunteers, we now number 18.

It is said that God's work, done under His direction, will never lack His provision. We praise the Almighty, for truly, this has been our experience.

The program is continually evolving and Parents have asked that we conduct classes more than once a week.

We had had to halt the intake of kids temporarily due to insufficient teachers, but from January 2025, new students have been added on.

We still need more volunteers to teach Maths, Science & Sinhala, especially those who are willing to work one-on-one with those kids who do not benefit much from group lessons.

Prayer Needs

- That the church leadership & the team might remain in the centre of His will in all future decisions & courses of action.
- That those whom God is calling to volunteer in the program, might respond to His call.

- For resilience, perseverance & trust in God alone, for the team of volunteers, that we might not be discouraged
- Most importantly, a commitment to the total wellbeing of the precious lives that God has entrusted to us, in the face of challenges.
- God's wisdom & sensitivity for the team, to build relationships of trust & confidence with the parents, so we might reflect Jesus well.
- Sensitivity, insight & wisdom from God in helping each child not only to advance in academic proficiency, but also to feel loved, valued & cared for.
- With the average weekly attendance hovering around 30, please pray that parents might be motivated to send their children regularly.
- Opportunities to effectively witness to the truth of Christ's message of salvation to the kids & their families, by word & deed.
- 38% of our monthly expenditure on food, as well as costs for any additional programs (eg Christmas program, teacher training workshop etc) come out of donations from well - wishers.

We are immensely grateful & praise our Lord for each one of you who has partnered with us & continue to do so, through prayer, encouragement & monetary support.



Reflecting on our roots: a glimpse into the history of our Church Christopher Elliott MD 1809 to 1859

Do you remember these plaques in the church?



Yes, these plaques are in memory of Dr. Christopher Elliott and his wife, who were active members of CGBC in the 1800s. We were delighted to connect with Richard, Dr. Elliott's great-great-grandson, and his wife Marilyn, who visited and worshiped with us in December 2024. It was a meaningful moment to make the connection to Dr. Christopher Elliott's legacy.





After their visit, Richard sent a brief history of Dr. Elliott, which we are grateful to have received and learn more about this important part of our church's history.

Christopher Elliott MD 1809 – 1859 A Brief History

Christopher Elliott, M.D. was born in Ireland in 1809. He earned his MD Degree in Dublin and in 1834 came to Sri Lanka (called Ceylon by the British) and was posted as Surgeon at Badulla. In 1836, he married Jessie Clark, the daughter of a Colombo merchant. That same year, he resigned his Badulla post to enter private practice and became editor of the Colombo Observer, a bi-weekly newspaper established in 1834 by the merchants of Colombo as a free press. He later purchased the newspaper.

After arriving in Colombo, Dr. Elliott joined CGBC where he remained active for 23 years until his death in 1859.

As editor and publisher of his newspaper, Dr. Elliott was an outspoken opponent of the government during the "Matale Rebellion" of 1848. 1848 was also the year he purchased the residence "Malmaison" later named Temple Trees. His wife died in 1855 leaving him with 7 children ranging in age from 6 to 16 with the four oldest away in school in England. His wife had to be buried in

the cemetery at the Wolvendaal Church since CGBC did not have a cemetery. But as a measure of how dear CGBC was to the family, Dr. Elliott arranged for a plaque in memory of his wife to be placed in the church. He sold the Temple Trees house soon after his wife's death. Today, Temple Trees is the official residence of the Prime Minister.



The next year he traveled to Ireland where he met and married Elizabeth (Bessie) Scott in Waterford. The couple then returned to Colombo where Bessie gave birth to a daughter in 1858. Also, in 1858, he was appointed Principal Civil Medical Officer which led him to sell the newspaper. Then on 22 May 1859, Dr. Elliott passed away after serving in his new position only a few months. Dr. Elliott served as a deacon of CGBC and according to the plaque the church placed next to his wife's, he was remembered as a "Preacher of the Gospel" to the CGBC congregation so he would have helped fill the pulpit as a lay preacher when needed. Both plaques are still on the rear wall of the sanctuary. He was buried beside his first wife outside the Wolvendaal Church. Later that year, Elizabeth returned to her family in Ireland where she gave birth to Dr. Elliott's tenth child, a son, eight months after his death.

Dr. Elliott's death did not end the Elliott family's association with Sri Lanka. Two of his children returned to Sri Lanka as adults.

Dr. Elliott's son Edward (1839–1921) took a Ceylon Civil Service position in 1865 and retired in 1897.

Dr. Elliott's son John (1841–1896) returned to Sri Lanka with his new Irish wife about 1869. They lived in Kandy for about 8 years where they had the first four of their eleven children.

Later, the family emigrated to America.



Juinor Youth Challenge (for children ages 11 to 15), meets on the 1st and 3rd Sundays after the English service. The programme is up to 2 pm.






